

Admission requirements

MINIMUM AGE

18 years old at the start of semester.

MINIMUM ENGLISH LANGUAGE ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

If English is not your first language, or if you have not spent the last two years studying in a school where English is the primary language of instruction, please enclose a copy of:

- International English Language Test (IELTS): 6 overall (min. 5.5 in every subcomponent)
- Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL): 550 (paper-based) - 80 (internet-based)
- First Cambridge Exam: Grade A or Cambridge Advanced Exam: Grade C
- For London, same as above, except Non-EU or EEA passport holders will need to undertake IELTS UKVI: 6.0 overall and min. 6.0 in every subcomponent.
