Terms and Conditions

Application Fee

A non-refundable fee of CHF 275 is required with each application for Les Roches Global Hospitality Education. Please see section on “Method of Payment”.

Tuition fees and fees associated with the studies

The compulsory academic expenses cover the following:

- Tuition fees
- Access to academic facilities on campus (e.g. library access, innovation lab and digital learning support) and academic tutoring and support during the residential week in Crans-Montana
- Access to recreational facilities on campus (e.g. student gym, student events space, etc.) and access to sports activities and training during the residential week in Crans-Montana
- Career and internship guidance and professional development opportunities (career fair, industry workshops, personalised counselling, job search, etc.)
- Health and wellbeing support during the residential week in Crans-Montana (basic medical and counselling support by campus nurses, campus counsellor)
- On-campus security service 24/7 through Les Roches Campus Security during the residential week in Crans-Montana
- Access to specific campus organized events (e.g. leadership series, industry events) and extra-curricular activities and conferences that might happen during the residential week in Crans-Montana
- Cantonal and communal taxes linked to the residential week in Crans-Montana
- Swiss VAT
- Contribution to examination costs (except resit or retake examinations)
- Access to Microsoft Office automation licenses
- Reception and postal distribution service on campus during the residential week in Crans-Montana
- Access to Alumni services (lifetime membership to the Les Roches Alumni Association, access to networking and reunion events)
- Learning resources tailored to suit the needs of executive level participants and program that usually comprise a variation of different support material such as textbooks, digital resources, online accesses to software and databases, copyright and licenses.

Executive coaching

Every EMBA participant has access to personalized coaching, provided by a specialist partner consultancy. Three one-to-one sessions can be organised to help participants build their self-awareness and personal brand; teach them about the power of storytelling to win over potential employers or strike new partnerships; and advise them on how to maximise the value of their professional network.

IT (device & service support – optional)

EMBA participants will be given individual access to our learning platform, which hosts program information, including support and teaching documents and other learning resources.

Participants should use their own laptop which must meet the school's specifications as per the Laptop Policy which can be consulted at lesroches.edu/apply/accepted-student-information/computer-policy/

Residential weeks (compulsory)

The two residential weeks are a compulsory part of the program. Expenses are estimated and subject to change with currency variations and other factors. The residential weeks fees cover an array of different expenses that might differ between Crans-Montana and Dubai. The details are specified in the different sections of this document.

Fee associated with lodging, board, and transportation

Crans-Montana

Transport to and from all school-planned activities/visits are included in the fees.

On-campus/official hotel accommodation is provided for EMBA participants. The standard rate covers accommodation in a single room and includes all costs relating to heating, electricity, maintenance, bed linen, housekeeping service (once a week), free wifi.

Full board is provided for all EMBA participants.

Dubai

There are no shuttles provided to EMBA participants upon arrival/departure to and from Dubai airport to the designated residential week hotel. Transport to and from all school-planned activities/visits are included in the fees.

Single-room accommodation in a designated "official" hotel will be provided to all participants. Participants wanting to stay in private accommodation are free to do so, there will however not be any refund.

Half board (breakfast in official hotel & lunch) is provided for all EMBA participants.

Insurance

EMBA participants are responsible for verifying that their private health and accident covers are valid while in Switzerland or Dubai.

Les Roches will not cover any related expenses. Personal and private insurance, to cover issues such as damage or theft of personal property, is not compulsory but is strongly recommended and is the participant's responsibility.

Les Roches cannot be held responsible for the theft of personal belongings, participant damage or third party insurance.

Visa application procedure for accepted candidates

As some participants might require a Visa to enter Switzerland or Dubai, they are kindly requested to verify Visa requirements for their nationality and apply at the right time.

Please note that it may take some time to obtain a Visa. Once officially admitted to the program, participants should enquire about Visas as soon as possible and speak with an Educational Counselor for any questions about the procedure.

Late cancellation fee & refund policy

Except as described hereinafter, all fees outlined and paid for are non-refundable. If a new participant cancels one month before the official day of the start of the program, a cancellation fee of CHF 5,000.- will be retained. If a participant cancels his/her studies after the deadline mentioned above, the full amount of the program will be charged.

If a participant is suspended, expelled, or withdraws on his/her own wish once the program has started, no fees will be reimbursed. In case of mitigating circumstances (e.g. medical, financial hardship, or similar), validated by a member of the school's management, exceptions may apply.

If a participant decides to postpone one or more modules, the positive balance can be carried over for a maximum of two years after the first official program start.

Payments

Unless a payment plan contract has been approved, payments must be made in full in Swiss francs no later than a month prior to the start of the program.

Payments can be made by bank transfer, check, credit card or online at lesroches.flywire.com.

Participants will not be permitted to begin their studies until payment for the program has been received. Academic transcripts and degrees are only delivered / awarded upon full settlement of all outstanding fees.

Method of payment

Les Roches has partnered with Flywire to provide you with an easy and secure method of sending international payments.

Financial aid and Scholarship

Les Roches provides a limited number of scholarships for new participants. The scholarships are competitive and linked to Les Roches' admissions strategy which aims to assist motivated professionals to pursue their education in our institution. Each scholarship has specific criteria. Eligibility for a scholarship is examined on a case-by-case basis for those candidates who have submitted a complete application. Applications must be made at least four months prior to the start of the intended semester of study.

Review of fees

Les Roches reserves the right to review and modify the tuition fees of each semester at any time and without notice.

Sponsorship

Sponsorship is a financial commitment by a sponsor (parent, legal guardian, employer, or any other person) where the sponsor undertakes to pay any fees and other charges on behalf of the participant. Notwithstanding any sponsorship commitment as part of the application process, the participant remains liable for any outstanding debt.

Any reference in these Terms and Conditions to liability of participants shall also infer liability on the sponsor of the participant as the case may be and such liability is joint and several.

Accreditations and recognitions

Accreditations

New England Commission of Higher Education

Les Roches Global Hospitality Education is accredited by the New England Commission of Higher Education (formerly the Commission on Institutions of Higher Education of the New England Association of Schools and Colleges, Inc.).

Accreditation of an institution of higher education by the Commission indicates that it meets or exceeds criteria for the assessment of institutional quality periodically applied through a peer review process. An accredited college or university is one which has available the necessary resources to achieve its stated purposes through appropriate educational programs, is substantially doing so, and gives reasonable evidence that it will continue to do so in the foreseeable future. Institutional integrity is also addressed through accreditation.

Accreditation by the Commission is not partial but applies to the institution as a whole. As such, it is not a guarantee of every course or program offered, or the competence of individual graduates. Recognitions

Recognized as a degree-awarding institution by the education department of the Canton of Valais (Les Roches Crans-Montana).

Since 2015, Swiss higher education institutions have the obligation to acquire federal institutional accreditation.

Before 2015, Les Roches, alongside other private institutions in Switzerland, opted for foreign institutional accreditation or local recognition of programs.

Les Roches currently holds:

- Institutional accreditation since 2006 from the New England Commission of Higher Education (NECHE), allowing graduates to transfer to other institutions with an internationally recognized degree.
- Program recognition since 2002 from the higher education authorities in charge of assessing and recognizing programs within the Valais region of Switzerland, allowing students to receive degrees endorsed by the local authorities. Les Roches academic programs are however not covered by the “Ordonnance du Conseil des hautes écoles sur la coordination de l’enseignement dans les hautes écoles suisses (CSHE)” of November 29, 2019, and thus do not provide automatic access to the Swiss higher education sector.

Constantly pursuing academic excellence, Les Roches actively seeks additional higher education accreditation in its continuing commitment to quality enhancement and to providing students with the best possible positioning to succeed in their future endeavors, both academically and professionally. As a result, Les Roches has entered the process of Swiss Institutional Accreditation, recently made available to Swiss private schools. Les Roches has been officially accepted as a candidate for Swiss federal accreditation as a University of Applied Sciences Institute.
